**Bridging Scholarship** | <http://www.aatj.org/studyabroad/japan-bridging-scholarships>

Japanese Bridging project provides scholarship opportunities to American undergraduate students participating in study-abroad programs in Japan. Bridging Scholarship recipients receive a stipend of \$2,500 (for students on semester-long programs) or \$4,000 (for students on academic year programs). Students studying in Japan on summer programs are not eligible to apply.

**Critical Language Scholarships for Intensive Summer Institutes** | <http://www.clscholarship.org/>

This scholarship is part of the National Security Language Initiative, a U.S. government interagency effort to encourage Americans to study critical need foreign languages. The scholarship will provide funding for U.S. citizen undergraduate, master's and Ph.D. students to participate in beginning, intermediate and advanced level summer language programs at American Overseas Research Centers in eleven critical need foreign languages (Arabic, Azerbaijani, Bangla/Bengali, Chinese, Hindi, Korean, Persian, Punjabi, Russian, Turkish, and Urdu).

Over 200 scholarships between \$500 and \$2,500 will be awarded this calendar year for U.S. and Canadian citizens to study internationally. Award amounts will vary with the average award being approximately \$1,000.

**Fund for Education Abroad** | <http://fundforeducationabroad.org/applicants/>

Fund for Education Abroad offers scholarships to US citizens or permanent residents currently enrolled as undergraduates in US universities/colleges who plan to study abroad for at least four weeks. Students can be awarded up to \$10,000.

**German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) / Research in Germany** | <https://www.daad.org/>

The German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) offers graduate scholarships to highly qualified graduate students, Ph.D. candidates and post-doctoral researchers for study and/or research at universities or institutes in Germany. These scholarships provide funds for ten months. In general, student applicants must be U.S. citizens enrolled full-time in a degree program. Foreign nationals may be able to apply if they have been full-time graduate students at the UO for more than one academic year at the time of application. Available for students in all fields except medicine. Please note that DAAD applicants are expected to apply also for Fulbright scholarships. The Gilman Scholarship program is awarded to undergraduate students who are receiving Federal Pell Grant funding on study abroad programs worldwide. Students are eligible to receive up to \$5,000 for semester long study abroad programs.

The National Security Education Program (NSEP) David L. Boren Graduate Fellowships enable U.S. graduate students to pursue specialization in area and language study or to add an international dimension to their education. Boren Fellowships support students pursuing the study of languages, cultures, and world regions that are critical to U.S. national security and less frequently studied by U.S. graduate students. The maximum award for study abroad is \$10,000 per semester.

The Timothy Sarbaugh Scholarship is awarded by Spokane's Limerick Sister City Society. The scholarship is intended to honor the memory of the late Tim Sarbaugh, a professor at GU until his untimely death, and to assist a student who will study at the University of Limerick for at least a full semester.
