ACADEMIC GUIDELINES AND EQUIVALENCES

- **Students must take Span 301 on Gonzaga's campus (and pass it with at least a B grade) before studying in this program. A GPA of 3.0 in Spanish is expected.**
  - With the exception of the Intensive Spanish class (Span 290), all listed courses taken by students at the *Curso de Estudios Hispánicos* (advanced) level at the Centro de Lenguas Modernas (CLM) will be counted for upper-division Spanish credits and/or for other disciplines (see page 3). If students are placed at *Lengua y Cultura* (intermediate) level at the CLM, they will receive lower division Spanish credits (with the exception of Span 320/319, Span 340, and Span 385 for ILACA Visiting Professor's class in the Spring) (see page 4).
- A. CURSO DE ESTUDIOS HISPÁNICOS (CEH) (ADVANCED LEVEL) (16/19 CREDITS)

A student at the *Curso de Estudios Hispánicos* (CEH) (levels 7, 8, 9 at the CLM) takes the following classes while in Granada (**Classes in bold are mandatory**)

1. **Intensive Spanish** (first 3 weeks) \*Span 290 (4 credits)
2. **One from the following three classes:**
  - a. **Oral Production and Interaction Skills in Spanish** \*Span 306 (3 credits)
  - b. **Spanish Grammar** \*Span 309 (3 credits)
  - c. **Writing Texts in Spanish** \*Span 320 (former Span 302) (3 credits)  
\* Before selecting a, b, or c, participants should consider the classes they have already taken at GU. If they have not taken Span 320/Span 302 on the Gonzaga campus, they must take "Writing Texts in Spanish." If they have taken Span 320/Span 302 on campus, they should choose between "Oral Production..." (advised) or "Spanish Grammar."
3. **Spanish Culture and Civilization (Development of Spanish Cultures: A Pluralistic Approach)** \*Span 340 (3 credits)
4. 2 or 3 other classes from the list on page 3 (6/9 credits)

Important: If a student has already taken Span 320/302 plus another class between 301 and 319 on the Gonzaga campus, it is required that the student take classes at Span 321 and higher listed on page 3. Please, refer to the Spanish major degree requirements for more information.

**B. CURSO DE LENGUA Y CULTURA ESPAÑOLAS (CLCE) (INTERMEDIATE LEVEL) (16-19 CREDITS)**

A student at the *Curso de Lengua y Cultura Españolas* (CLCE) (levels 5 and 6) takes the following classes while in Granada (**Classes in bold are mandatory**)

1. **Intensive Spanish** (first 3 weeks) \*Span 290 (4 credits)
2. **Notions of Spanish Grammar (levels 5 or 6)** \*Span 285 (3 credits)
3. **Speaking and Writing Skills (levels 5 or 6)** \*Span 320, or Span 319 if student already took Span 320/302 on campus (3 credits)
4. **Spanish Culture and Civilization (Development of Spanish Cultures: A pluralistic Approach)** \*Span 340 (3 credits)
5. 1 or 2 other classes from the list on page 4 (3/6 credits)

**DELE (“DIPLOMA DE ESPAÑOL COMO LENGUA EXTRANJERA”)**

- All students will get preparation for the official DELE exam, administered by the Ministry of Education and Professional Development in Spain. Preparation for the DELE is part of Span 340 class (Spanish Civilization and Culture). Students will get information about this important component of the program in Granada. The exam will take place at the end of the semester. If passed, student obtains an official Spanish certificate from the Spanish government.

## **CURSO DE LENGUA Y CULTURA ESPAÑOLAS (CLCE)** **(Intermediate level)**

**Each course is 3 credit hours, except for Span 290 (4 credits)**

Students that do not qualify for *Curso de Estudios hispánicos* (advanced level) will get lower-division Spanish credits, with the exception of Span 320 (Span 319 if student took 320/302 on the Gonzaga campus)/Span 340/Span 385 (only in the Spring)
