## THE OXFORD STUDY ABROAD PROGRAMME

OSAP makes it possible for qualified students to study in Oxford for one, two, or three terms as an Associate Member or Visiting Student in one of several Oxford colleges. Together with cooperating programs of US colleges, OSAP is the largest overseas study program in Oxford.

## OXFORD COLLEGE AFFILIATION

Associate Members: Students with GPAs of 3.0 or higher may enroll as Associate Members of New College (founded 1379), Christ Church (founded 1546), or Trinity College (founded 1554) with the approval of the Oxford college.

Visiting Students: Students with GPAs of 3.7 or higher may apply for Visiting Student status, which includes full university privileges at one of two Medieval colleges: New College (1379) or Magdalen College (1458).

## HOUSING

All students live in the central university area of Oxford in houses and flats equipped with wireless internet and fully-furnished kitchens. The OSAP program, we believe, has arranged the best housing for non-graduating students in Oxford.

## CULTURE

OSAP offers a variety of excursions to help students learn the history and culture of Oxford and the surrounding area. During the full-length terms, students may participate in Oxford's myriad of clubs and societies, including rowing teams, dancing groups, debate and theatre societies, and more.

## TUTORIALS AND CREDITS

Students study for 13-14 weeks a term in one-on-one tutorial courses with 14-18 meetings a term. As a result, almost any academic subject may be studied with highly qualified and experienced tutors who regularly teach Oxford University degree candidates. Graduate study is also possible.

## SUMMER STUDY

Students will be able to study almost any academic subject in very flexible periods of their own choosing in our summer sessions, which start on one of three dates in May, June, or July, and continue for 4, 6, 8, 10, or 12 weeks.

## TUITION AND FEES
